Course Description	<p>The course deals with the activities of the Catholic Church in Croatia and the Croatian lands during the 20th century. The above implies the state, activity and position of the church hierarchy and believers during the existence of the Kingdom of Serbs, Croats and Slovenes, the Kingdom of Yugoslavia, the Independent State of Croatia, the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and the Republic of Croatia. International aspects of the activities of the Catholic Church in Croatia and Croatian countries during the mentioned period will also be taken into account. The central emphasis of the course will be on political and social phenomena and occurrences.</p>
